

Veggie Garden

Each plant has a marker in it with a number that identifies it. Refer to this list for planting tips and information about each plant. Many pictures are not mine, they are from Johnny's Seeds, where I buy many of my seeds from.

All of these varieties need full sun, plenty of moisture (stick your finger in the soil to see if it's dry, do not overwater) and well amended soil. Check for problems daily and take care of any issues that arise early. For aphids, spray off with a hose.

20. Bell Pepper – Orange



This variety did very well for me last year so I decided to grow it again. Flavorful, juicy peppers. They start off green and then turn orange if you leave them on the plant.

21. Tomato – Sungold



This cherry tomato plant produces the sweetest tomatoes I have ever tried. This plant is indeterminate, meaning that it will keep growing and has gotten to be 6 feet tall. Provide adequate support.

22. Delicata Squash



This squash is very sweet and the skin is tender enough to eat.

23. Cucumber – Bush Champion Organic



Produces an abundance of 8-12" fruit on compact plants. Needs 12" space.

24. Eggplant – Orient Express



This variety did very well for me last year, producing lots of firm, delicious eggplants.

25. Bush Beans – Provider



Produces 5" long bean pods on compact plants.
